## **PBS Western Reserve Secures Five Emmy Nominations**

Kent, Ohio — May 10, 2024 — PBS Western Reserve has received five 2024 regional Emmy nominations from the Central Great Lakes Region of the National Academy of Television Arts & Sciences. The organization's series City Centric received one nomination. The Master Craftsman and The World According to Polka — independent productions with broadcast premieres on PBS Western Reserve — each received two nominations. Award winners will be announced Saturday, June 22, at the Great Lakes Emmy Awards ceremony in Cleveland.

The productions, which are part of PBS Western Reserve's LuminUS: Stories About Us collection, tell these stories that are singularly focused on the Northeast Ohio region:

- City Centric is a six-part series that showcases dedicated and inspirational people from six cities in our region who shape their communities and explores how their communities have, in turn, shaped them. The program's producer, James Waters, was nominated in the Magazine Program category.
- The Master Craftsman is a 30-minute show that provides a close-up view of local artist Richard Grell, showcasing his exceptional woodworking abilities in handcrafting Windsor chairs. Phillip Sieb is the filmmaker and director, and Philip Leiter is the director of photography. The production was nominated in the Lifestyle and Photographer: Long Form Content categories.
- The World According to Polka is a six-part series that follows Ohio's zany Chardon Polka Band on a
  journey across Northeast Ohio and beyond as it explores the rich history and lively culture surrounding
  polka. The series is hosted by the band's lead singer, Jacob Kouwe, who was nominated for an
  award in the Host, Narrator category. Series co-creators Kouwe and Jeff Grau were nominated in the
  Entertainment category.

"We are excited and honored to receive these nominations, which confirm that PBS Western Reserve provides high-quality programming to our audience," said Ryan Donchess, PBS Western Reserve director of content.

"We share our excitement with the talented nominees of these shows and are proud to have partnered with them on the productions." All three productions can be livestreamed at PBSWesternReserve.org.
